






Kentucky Poultry Counties




- 1.7 Billion dollar industry

- One additional company and a secondary processer moves to Kentucky


Kentucky Energy Efficiency Project







Most Broiler houses will use 1100-1200 gallons of water per day. Water is also use by the cool cells 4 to 5 months a year.



Item	Est. Cost	Savings	Payback, yrs
Insulate S.W. Curtain	\$ 4,400	725 gal	3.0
Insulate Ceiling	\$ 3,100	450 gal	3.4
Attic Inlets	\$ 1,800	500 gal	1.8
Tunnel Inlet Doors	\$ 5,900	450 gal	6.6
Mixing Fans	\$ 600	120 gal	2.5
Radiant Tube Heaters	\$ 7,200	500 gal	7.2
Cold Cathode Lights	\$ 1,000	11,000kWh	0.8
