Mercer County Conservation District on 227 Morris Drive phone number is 859-734-4326 extension 3. The District has a continuous sign-up period for the **State Cost-share Program**. At the present time, applications will be taken through 9/29/2023. This is a 75% cost-share program with landowners receiving up to \$20,000 for practices completed. Call Linda Lake, Adm. Secretary or Brandon Campbell, Soil Conservationist for more information. The District also has four Haybuster No-Till Seed Drills for rent. The Truax drill will plant native warm-season grasses. The drills rent for \$6.50 per acre or a minimum of \$65 plus a \$36 delivery fee. The

District also has one Broyhill 200-gallon sprayer with power takeoff for use **free of charge** with a \$36 delivery fee. The district has one 300 gallon Best Way power take off sprayer for **2,4-D spray** only which controls thistles and broadleaf weeds, and one 200 gallon Broyhill sprayer for ROUNDUP USE. Both sprayers rent for \$50 per day and a \$36 delivery fee. The GrassWorks Weed Wiper rents for \$75.00 per day with a \$36 delivery fee. The 2-row John Deere corn planter rents for \$70 the first day, \$50 additional days, plus a \$36 delivery fee. The Wheatheart post driver rents for \$200 per day and \$275 per weekend. Contact Equipment Manager Johnnie Bailey at 859-613-6889 for scheduling of this equipment. Remember the **TREE REBATE CERTIFICATE** where the District continues to give Mercer County landowners up to \$75 if you purchase trees from Reynolds Nursery.


Kentucky Farm Bureau Depredation Sub-Permit Application Program

Kentucky Farm Bureau has received a limited statewide depredation permit that allows for a limited number of black vulture "takes" where black vultures are depredating livestock. Interested livestock producers may request a sub-permit application by emailing Renee Carrico at renee.carrico@kyfb.com or calling 502-495-5137. You can also stop by the local offices and pick up an application.

Any livestock producers experiencing severe depredation from black vultures is encouraged to apply for an individual migratory bird depredation permit from the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service. Producers can not apply for both a KFB permit and a separate individual permit
