Legislative Report No. 3 2024 Kentucky General Assembly

Today marked the ninth legislative day of the 2024 Session of the Kentucky General Assembly. The legislature will not convene on Monday, January 15, in observance of the Martin Luther King Jr. holiday. They are scheduled to come back Tuesday, January 16, 2024. There has been a total of 170 senate and 282 house bills and resolutions introduced in the first nine legislative days.

Some Bills of Interest:

HB 217: D. Hale - AN ACT relating to hunting and fishing licenses and declaring an emergency.

This bill will remove the requirement that resident owners of farmlands must own five or more acres of land in order to be exempt from sport hunting and sport fishing license requirements when hunting or fishing on their own farmlands. The bill has been assigned to the House Tourism and Outdoor Recreation Committee.

SB 5: G. Williams - AN ACT relating to hunting and fishing licenses and declaring an emergency.

This bill will remove the requirement that resident owners of farmlands must own five or more acres of land in order to be exempt from sport hunting and sport fishing license requirements when hunting or fishing on their own farmlands. This bill passed the Senate 36-0 and now heads to the House for their consideration.

KFB Policy:

"We oppose a minimum acreage standard below which landowners must obtain a hunting or fishing license for lawful activities on their own property."

SB 16: J. Schickel – AN ACT relating to agricultural operation interference.

This bill will prohibit the operation of unmanned aircraft, video or audio recording devices, or photography equipment on or above a concentrated animal feeding operation or commercial food manufacturing or processing facility without written consent of the owner or authorized representative of the facility and establish a Class B misdemeanor for violations. This bill has been assigned to the Senate Agriculture Committee.

KFB Policy:

"We support legislation that would require written permission or a warrant to access real and private property by state agencies, including unmanned surveillance."

HB 218: S. Lewis - AN ACT relating to identity documents.

This bill will require the Transportation Cabinet to give notice to individuals of pending expiration of operator's licenses, instruction permits, and personal identification cards and specify the manner of notification.

KFB Policy:

"We support driver's license expiration notices being mailed to individuals a month prior to expiration."

HCR 23: D. Johnson – A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION urging the United States Congress to enact legislation allowing states to permanently adopt daylight saving time.

KFB Policy:

"We recommend daylight saving time be retained year-round."
