



Interim Finance Program

- 474 borrowers to date
- Approximately \$1.2 billion loaned since 1995
- 2.1% 2.7% **Average cost of funds**
- Current loan rate 2.65%

Flexible Term Finance Program


- Program began June 2001
- 285 Loans for over \$497 million
- Flexible term from 1 to 30 years
- Estimated 25-year borrowing rate as of 3/17/2021: 2.51%
- A+ rated program

February 2021 Ice Storm

- Freezing rain coated a large portion of eastern Kentucky with up to 3/4" of ice.
- Power outages topped 150,000 with northern & eastern Kentucky hardest hit.
- 43 water utilities lost power affecting 192,000 customers.
- Thanks to preparation and water storage only 11,000 customers lost water service.
- Over 33,000 customers were under a boil water advisory.
- KRWA partnered with utilities and coordinated with EEC & KYEM to distribute generators preventing 1,700 additional customers from losing service.

County Declarations City Declarations Map




March 2021 Flooding

- Rainfall began February 27 w/ portions of eastern Kentucky receiving over 6" of rain in 48 hours.
- Flash floods washed out miles of water line,
 flooded sewer plants & inundated pump stations.
- 32 drinking water utilities impacted that served a combined 147,000 customers.
- Over 8,600 customers lost service.
- Over 27,000 customers were under a boil water advisory.

March 2021 Flooding

- KRWA partnered with member utilities and coordinated with EEC and KYEM to distribute bypass pumps, deliver repair parts & materials and provide personnel to restore water service to over 3,800 customers.
- KRWA staff expended 285 hours over 8 days with one circuit rider remaining onsite at a utility for 7 days.

COVID Relief Funds

CDBG Coronavirus Response (CDBG-CV) Program

- Provide assistance to households in danger of utility disconnection (water, sewer, gas, electric)
- Cities and Counties are eligible applicants
- Payment made exclusively from non-profit to utility provider
- Each household may receive up to \$250/month for 6 consecutive months
- Must be in arrears between January 2020 present

COVID Relief Funds

Healthy at Home Eviction Relief Fund

- Prevent evictions and keep Kentucky renters housed during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Allow landlords to get substantial payments for back rent.
- Reduce the volume of eviction cases in Kentucky courts.
- 100% of utility arrears for up to 12 months + 3 months future utilities. (heat, electric, water, sewer, wastewater)

COVID Relief Funds

American Rescue Plan Act 2021

- \$1.9 Trillion Pandemic Relief
- \$130.2 billion Local Fiscal Recovery Fund
 - Investment in Water, Sewer and Broadband
- State and Local Allocations Kentucky
 - Total \$4.244 billion
 - State \$2.441 billion, Metro \$445 million
 - Counties \$866 million, Non-Counties \$307 million
