Essay 2: In 300 words or less: "Why am I pursuing a post-secondary education?"

Applicants for the Leadership in Agriculture Scholarship must <u>also</u> submit a narrative describing their family farming operation in addition to the two essays listed.

For the statewide scholarships that are administered from the Kentucky Farm Bureau Education Foundation, you may receive a request for a short video submission answering one to two questions. An email will be sent to the address listed in the application in early March with those details and questions for those students competing for the statewide scholarships.
