

# BULLITT COUNTY FARM BUREAU 2022 SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

#### ELIGIBILITY

The Bullitt County Farm Bureau Board of Directors will award 4 scholarships to high school seniors for the current school year. One of these scholarships will be designated for a student specifically pursuing an agriculture or agrelated career. The Young Farmer's Committee will also award at least one scholarship. Scholarships may be applied to tuition, housing, books, and other educational expenses. This application may be downloaded at kyfb.com/bullitt/county-corner. To be eligible all applicants must:

- Have either a minimum of 2.5 cumulative GPA (on a 4.0 scale) or a minimum of 19 ACT score.
- •Be the child of a **Bullitt** County Farm Bureau member and remain such while the scholarship is in force.
- Finish high school within the year they apply for the scholarship.

#### **RULES**

- Recipient may enter accredited college/university or a vocational/technical institute.
- •Recipient must enter college as a beginning freshman no later than the fall semester following high school graduation, unless a circumstance beyond the student's control, such as a serious illness or injury, prevents enrollment at that time. In such a case, recipient must enter college by the spring semester of the following year or the scholarship will be forfeited.
- Dropping out of school, except for serious illness or injury, shall cause the recipient to lose the scholarship.
- •Winner must be a full-time student each semester unless an exception is requested in writing and approved.
- •Winner is required to furnish a transcript before additional monies are sent to the student.
- •Student must maintain a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5 after each semester. A lower GPA will be reviewed by the scholarship committee for possible forfeiture. (Only beginning freshmen will be given a second chance to improve their overall GPA.)
- •All application materials must be postmarked by March 15, 2022, or hand-delivered by that date to:

- An essay of 300 words or less, explaining your reasons for pursuing a college education. In addition, you should provide an estimate of your first year of college expenses, how you plan to finance your education, the amount of financial aid and awards received to date, and whether you plan to work while attending college.

## SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE

The Bullitt County Farm Bureau will give out four scholarships in the amount of either \$2,000 for a four year school or \$1,000 for vocational or technical school. One of these scholarships will be reserved for a student pursuing an agriculture related field. These will be given at \$250 per semester for either 2 or 4 years.

The Young Farmer's Committee also awards at least one scholarship in the amount of \$1,000 or \$750. This will be given out as one lump sum.
