Kentucky and Jackson County Farm Bureau offers scholarship to high school seniors

Kentucky Farm Bureau has several scholarships to offer High School Seniors. You may stop by your local office to pick up an application.

The KFB Education Foundation will award college scholarships ranging from \$400 to \$4000 to 83 high school seniors pursing a four-year degree. To be considered, students must complete the application and return the requested material to KFB postmarked by February 28, 2015.
