Livestock producers: Remember!! If you have cattle or other livestock losses, you MUST notify the FSA office within 30 days from the date of the loss in order to meet program eligibility. NOTIFICATION must be made within 30 days. ARC/PLC (corn program) signups can now be taken and will continue until August 1st, 2018. Also, if you have a change of address OR change bank accounts DON'T FORGET to notify our office. And last but not least, if you have an email account, go online and subscribe to our online newsletter to http://www.fsa.usda.gov/subscribe and keep informed! Food Check-Out Week

Food Check-Out Week is a national campaign led by the American Farm Bureau Federation commemorating America's healthy, nutritious, abundant, and affordable

food supply. Mercer County Farm Bureau will hold events to help heighten awareness of these aspects of our food supply and help bring thanks and recognition to the farmers.

Americans currently spend, on average, just over 10 percent of their disposable, personal income for food—THE LOWEST IN THE WORLD. Applying that statistic to the calendar year means the average household will have earned enough disposable income to pay for its annual food supply in about 7 weeks. In recognition of this, Kentucky Farm Bureau is celebrating February 18-24, 2018, as Food Check-Out Week.

College Scholarships Available due February 28, 2018

\$1,000 Mercer Co. Farm Bureau Scholarship

For several years, Mercer County Farm Bureau has awarded \$1,000 to a selected Mercer County senior each year to help pay for their college. Applications are available from high school counselors at MCSHS and Burgin and at the local Farm Bureau office. One application makes a student possibly eligible for the county scholarship as well as over 30 state-wide Kentucky Farm Bureau scholarships for high school seniors.

Eligibility requirements include:

- 1. Membership in Mercer Co. Farm Bureau
- 2. A Minimum 3.5 GPA or 23 ACT Score
- 3. Graduating High School Senior

Applicants are not required to be active in agriculture or farming. Winners are selected by Kentucky Farm Bureau in Louisville.

\$1,000 Mercer County Farm Bureau YOUNG FARMER Scholarship

This will be the sixth year for the Mercer County Farm Bureau Young Farmer Scholarship. This scholarship is designed to be awarded to a Mercer County student who is pursuing a college degree in Agriculture. Applicants are required to be a graduating high school senior from a member household and hold a minimum GPA of 2.5. This

scholarship requires a separate application from the Mercer Co. Farm Bureau Scholarship.

The application is available from the high school counselors, the MCSHS website, or the Mercer County Farm Bureau office on Morris Drive. Contact Beth or Leon at Farm Bureau for more details, or email Beth at Beth.Kelly@kyfb.com for a
