Mercer County Young Farmer of 2022 is Zac Lewis

Zac Lewis has been selected as Mercer County Farm Bureau's Young Farmer of the Year. Zac is married to Kristyna Coslow Lewis, a full time portrait photographer and realtor, and they have two children, Lochlan and Ramsey.

Zac is a 2007 graduate of Mercer Co. Senior High School where he was an active member & received numerous awards. While still in high school, Zac leased his first farm on his own from Mr. James Wheeler, buying and selling steers and heifers. He also continued to help on his family farm with his Dad, brother and uncle while also working at Tuggle Feed and for Ricky Keller's Custom Hay Service. Zac has been mostly involved in hay production and cattle and thankful to be able to work beside these men that instilled farming values and knowledge in him as a young farmer.



Today, Zac and his brother Zane own Lewis Livestock, partner on a Cow/Calf operation and also have partnerships with Jimmy

McGlone and their Dad as well. Currently the operation consists of weaning calves and backgrounding them several months to ensure healthy calves before selling. They produce both grass and alfalfa hay off of multiple farms in Mercer County as well.

In addition to managing his own operation, Zac started as a parts employee at the local John Deere Dealership in January of 2014, eventually became the parts manager and is now the Store Manager at Meade Tractor in Danville. Zac has also served as an officer on The Mercer County Cattleman's Association Board. Both Zac and Kristyna were active FFA members/Officers, both were raised on the farm and in church. Their family currently attends Mt. Pleasant Church. Kristyna worked for UK College of Agriculture Cooperative Extension Service from 2005-2013 before going full time with Kristyna Coslow Photography, LLC. This is her 19th year of Photography and she still incorporates the farm life in many of her sessions as well. Zac also has assisted Kristyna in owning and operating The Farmstead at Shawnee Springs Wedding Venue, a Kentucky Proud Venue; until selling in February of this year. Their son, Lochlan, is following in the tradition and is regularly found bottle feeding calves, helping feed, being the gate getter, lining up bales and most recently learning to drive a John Deere on his own while baling hay. Lochlan also has 2 first calf heifers that he just bought and currently has the family freezer full from a Longhorn steer that he raised for meat since he was 5. As most farming families do, Zac and Kristyna's lives revolve around cattle, hay season and the weather. They're blessed to be able to sustain this way of life even in the troubles that face farmers today.

Mercer County Conservation District at 227 Morris Drive in Harrodsburg has **for rent** five no-till seed drills, four 10ft. Haybuster drills plant cool season grasses. The 10ft. Truax drill plants native warm season grasses. Drills rent for \$6.50 per acre or a minimum of \$65 plus a \$36 delivery fee. Also, the district has one Broyhill 200 gallon power take-off sprayer. **This is for ROUNDUP spray only.** The 300 gallon Best Way sprayer will be used for **2-4D spray only.** Both sprayers will rent for \$50.00 per day, and a \$36.00 delivery fee. The Grass Works Weed Wiper rents for \$75.00 per day, plus \$36.00 delivery fee, and the John Deere 2-row Corn Planter rents for \$70.00 first day, \$50.00 additional days plus \$36.00 delivery fee. The Wheatheart Post Driver rents for \$200.00 per day or \$275.00 per weekend.Contact Equipment Manager, Johnnie Bailey at 859-613-2668 or 859-613-4377 to schedule delivery. The district also offers a Tree Rebate Certificate. The purpose is to provide all Mercer County tax payers a way to improve their properties and promote conservation in the county area, to promote local business with

nurseries in the Mercer County area that has a direct link to conservation, and provide a method of increasing the tree population in Mercer Co. and aid in the county being greener. Each landowner can receive 50% of cost of tree (with \$75.00 cap). The trees can be purchased from Reynolds Nursery at 219 Kirkwood Road, Salvisa, Ky 40372 or Garden Scapes Garden Center in Harrodsburg. Call the conservation office at 859-734-4326 ext. 8111 and speak with Linda for more information. The district will be taking State Cost-share applications beginning October 3, 2022 to be considered during the January 2024 ranking period. 
